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POLICY - SICK CHILDREN

2. Purpose

Baringa Early Learning Centre (Baringa) aims to maintain the health and wellbeing of all children, staff, and their families, ensuring a healthy environment and minimising cross-contamination and the spread of infectious illnesses by implementing best practice and high standards of personal hygiene within our Service.

3. Scope

3.1 This policy applies to children, families, staff, management, and visitors of Baringa.

4. Implementation

- 4.1 Centre Management and Educators will ensure:
 - a) Effective hygiene policies and procedures are adhered to at all times to prevent the spread of illnesses.
 - b) They promote effective hand hygiene and cough etiquette.
 - c) Effective environmental cleaning policies and procedures are adhered to all times.
 - d) Families are provided with relevant information from a trusted source about preventing the spread of illnesses.

- 4.2 If a child is unwell and may be infectious, we will not accept a child into the centre if they fall into any of the exclusion categories listed in the *Dealing with Infectious Disease Policy* (schedule 1 Exclusions) and/or if they:
 - a) have a temperature above 38.0°C when assessed prior to entry to the service (effective during a pandemic or outbreak of an infectious disease)
 - b) have been given Paracetamol or Ibuprofen within 24 hours prior to arriving at Baringa (for example: Panadol).
- 4.3 Children may become unwell throughout the day, in which case Centre Management and educators will respond to children's individual symptoms of illness and provide immediate comfort and care. In these circumstances, educators will:
 - a) Closely monitor and document the child's symptoms on the Incident, Injury, Trauma, and Illness Record.
 - b) Provide children with rest in a supervised area away from other children until parents or the emergency contact person is able to collect them.
 - c) Take the child's temperature. If the child's temperature is 38°C or higher, the child's parents/guardian/emergency contacts will be contacted as soon as possible to have the child collected ASAP.
 - d) Educators will attempt to lower a child's temperature by:
 - removing excessive clothing (shoes, socks, jumper, pants) .
 - encouraging the child to take small sips of water.
 - where practicable, moving the child to a quiet area where they can rest whilst being supervised.
 - administering paracetamol, only when verbal or written permission from the child's parent or guardian has been received (as per the *Administration of Medication Policy*).
 - e) Keep accurate records of the child's events on the Incident, Injury, Trauma, and Illness Record.
 - f) Educators will complete the Incident, Injury, Trauma, or Illness Record, ensuring the form has been completed correctly, discussed with then signed by the parent or authorised guardian/emergency contact upon collection of their child.
 - g) Educators will thoroughly clean and disinfect any toys, resources or equipment that may be contaminated by a sick child.
- 4.4 In the event a parent/guardian does not make every effort to collect their child ASAP, Centre Management will proceed with *Grievance Policy* with the family. Centre Management reserves the right to terminate the child's position.
- 4.5 Parents/families will:
 - a) Assist Baringa to prevent the spread of disease, by monitoring their child's health and not allowing them to attend if they have an infectious illness or display symptoms of an illness.
 - b) Ensure they are familiar with the *Dealing with Infectious Diseases Policy* and the exclusions outlined in schedule 1 of this policy.
 - c) Implement effective hygiene routines at home such as regular handwashing and sneeze and cough routines (use of tissues, covering their mouth with coughing, sneezing into a tissue or elbow).
 - d) Communicate with Baringa if their child has been unwell in the past 24 hours or someone in the family is/has been sick and follow the advice provided regarding attendance to Baringa.
 - e) Make every effort to arrange for pick-up of their child from Baringa as soon as possible, when notified that their child is sick.
 - f) Produce a medical clearance statement upon Centre Management's request. This could be for children who have undergone surgery to ensure the child's safety prior to attending Baringa.
